EAST GOES WEST TO SAFETY HARBOR



Pat & I trekked west from Vero Beach on Friday, October 21st to Clearwater in anticipation of attending the "35th ALL BRITISH FIELD MEET & AUTOJUMBLE". We have been to this event numerous times and it is always a great event, held on Main Street for about eight blocks in downtown Safety Harbor, with in excess of 200 British cars angle parked on both sides of the street. There are many interesting shops and restaurants, both on Main Street and the adjoining side streets.

Upon arriving in Clearwater, (and surviving the DRIVE THRU HELL: Tampa) we drove to the downtown public library to view an exhibit titled "Daydreaming: Niki Butcher's Hand-painted Photography". It is a 60-image exhibit drawn from 50 years of her work. Niki is the wife of Clyde

Butcher, the world-famous nature photographer, famous for black and white photos, mostly in south Florida and the Glades. We were very impressed with her work as it is not like most painted photo artists where the entire photo is painted, but only key items. We highly recommend visiting this exhibit. The Butchers also have studios in Venice and Ochopee.

Saturday dawned bright, sunny, and quite cool. Great weather. Drove over to the show and found our assigned space which was at Main & 4th Ave. intersection. There were three MGB-GTs and 1 MGC-GT in our class, although the C was parked about a half block away. We backed in next to a beautiful blue GT which turned out to belong to fellow members of our MGCC-FLORIDA club, Doug and Linda Rothwell from Orange City. It was a great show and nice weather. As usual, great cars and bikes. Saw a lot of old friends, one of which was at first hard to recognize. He was sauntering down Main Street in front of the Paradise Restaurant wearing a Panama hat, a nice blue flowered shirt, and light colored slacks, a true Florida tourist, or so we thought. But no, it was Glenn Lenhard! What a surprise! Also visited with Phil Burke from Hobe Sound with his newly purchased MGB Tourer, Bruce & Bert Rauch, Hayes Harris of Wire Wheel in Vero, and others.

We purchased our GT in 2003 from Hank Rippert of Charlotte, N.C. after he had totally rebuilt the entire car. Hank was then the Chairman of the Nationwide New England MG T Registry and has since passed away in 2020. He owned and drove a famous black 1951 MG-TD- 8888, with cycle front fenders, for many years, and lead many MG tours. His daughter, Heather, is an artist and lives in Clearwater. She stopped by the car early in the day to visit and we later visited her at the syd entel galleries on Main Street. She was very pleased the GT was still being used actively.

And at the close of the show, we took home First Place in our class as I believe Glenn did also for a beautiful '74 Jensen Interceptor convertible he just finished restoring, and Jeff Zorn did take third for his '63 MGB. A Visit to the Morgan Factory Dale Lewis



If you dream hard enough, sometimes those dreams come true. Well, almost.

Truth is, what you really dream about (or for) is owning a beautiful, handmade sports car like a Morgan. I guess the closest I may ever get to that is visiting the Morgan Factory, which did happen recently. And I wasn't disappointed. Now, I'm not going to give a step-by-step tour like we got that day, just a few highlights. But I will say if you ever get the chance to go, do it. You will not be sorry.

The journey started with our guides showing a short film about Morgan.

Then we were off touring the workshops where very skilled craftsmen and women are making some of the most fantastic cars.

By the way, there will be a short quiz at the end of this article so be prepared.

We were amazed to see all the work that goes into making these fine automobiles – from the chassis shop to the paint building, it is truly something to experience. And you don't often hear your tour guide say "Now we'll go to the wood shop" while touring an auto factory. Morgan is probably the only place in the world that can still say that. While almost every piece of a Morgan is built in-house, they do not make their own engines. Currently, those are BMW engines – either a 2.0 litre four cylinder Twin Power

Turbo, which produces 255 bhp and up to 295 lb/ft of torque in the Plus 4 or a BMW B58 Twin Power Turbo inline six cylinder which produces 335 bhp for the Plus 6.

This factory was started in 1909, in the town of Malvern, Worcestershire, in the UK. by H.F.S. Morgan. Morgan's first car was the now iconic Morgan Three Wheeler, followed in 1936 by the Morgan 4-4 (based on a steel chassis). Today, each Morgan is hand crafted using three core elements: ash, aluminum and leather. Built to the highest standards by craftsmen and women whose skills are handed down through generations and perfected over a lifetime. There are no robots or automatic machines in use – even the louvres on the bonnet are made using a hand press cutter and “eye-balled” by the operator.

Most of the buildings where the cars are produced date back to between 1909 and the 1930's; the showroom is newer with a modern design, but the memorabilia and vehicles housed within one part reflect over 110 years of historical significance.

Today Morgan builds around 800 cars per year. When you order a Morgan, there are a plethora of choices to be made. First, which model do you want? They currently have three: the Plus 4, Plus 6 and the Super 3, their three-wheeled model.

Next – what interior? Not just the color of the seats and carpet, but the layout of the dashboard.

Remember, this is a handmade car being built just for you. And, speaking of colors, what about the body paint? They have 50 basic colors; however, you can have absolutely ANY color imaginable. Yes, bring them a color and they will match it and paint YOUR car with it. Those special details are why they say there are no two Morgan's that are exactly alike.

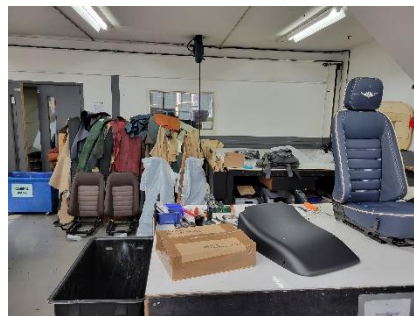
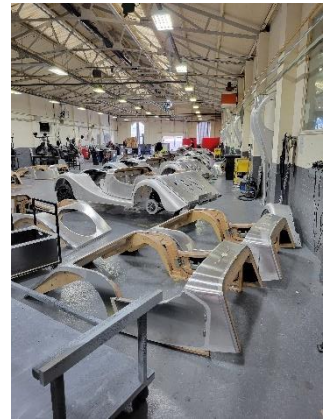

The answer is: Aluminum. Many may have said wood, but the frame is wood, not the chassis. The older models had a steel chassis, but the newer cars use an all-new bonded aluminum CX-Generation platform. To make the bodies, ash wood is cut, bent, shaped and bonded to form the frames (including the doors) then aluminum is cut and formed over the wooden structure.
