## **PRESIDENTS MESSAGE:**



What's in a name?

Got to thinking the other day (Oh \$%#&, not again, says my wife) What is the proper name for things created or born during certain time periods? Well, for automobiles there are several. The AACA and the State of Florida say anything over twenty-five years of age is antique so your

In the US, according to Wikipedia, there are several eras: Veteran (invention of automobile up to 1896), Brass Era (1890 to 1919), Antique Era (beginning up to 1920), and Vintage (1920 to 1930). Nothing more is said, so I guess anything after 1930 is "era-less". Too bad.

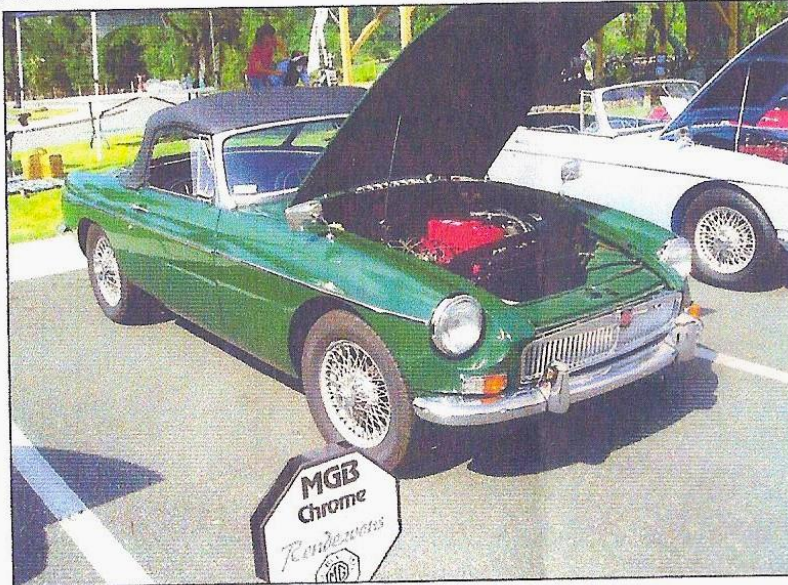

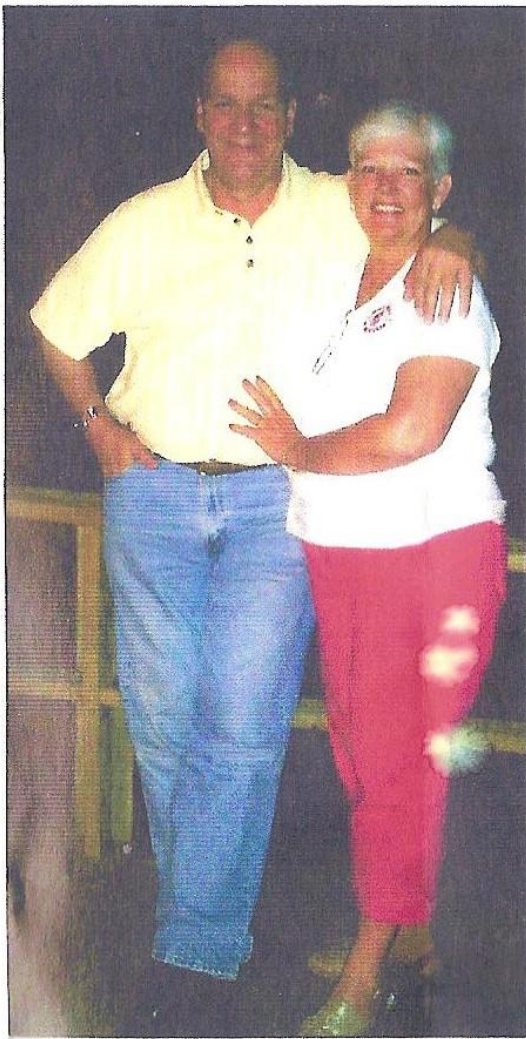
